

Alfred Radauer is senior consultant with Technopolis, a European consulting firm specialised in the topic of innovation and research policy. Alfred has more than 15 years of experience with innovation-related projects, particularly in the field of IPR.

In 2006/2007, he authored a study on benchmarking support services for SMEs in the field of IPR covering the EU, the U.S., Australia and Japan on behalf of the European Commission, DG Enterprise and Industry. Since then, he was contracted by the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property (the Swiss IP office) to review IPR support services for SMEs in Switzerland and help improve existing services and design new ones as well as by the German Ministry of Economics and Technology to review German SME support in the field of IPR. Further assignments for the design and the review of support services were carried out in Eastern Europe (Czech Republic, Romania, Serbia) or in Central Asia (Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan) as well as in Western European countries.

In addition, Alfred has worked on the topics of patent licensing (authoring the recent PATLICE survey of the European Commission), on counterfeiting and piracy (in the course of the Transatlantic IPR project), on the subject of copyright policy in Europe (for the European parliament) or on assessing the economic and societal impacts of inventions nominated for the yearly European Inventor Awards, organised by the EPO.

He has been recently advising WIPO during the course of studies on better integrating IP in the innovation systems of Serbia and Cameroon. Currently, Alfred is finishing a study estimating the costs of patenting in Europe (for the EPO) and is working on an impact assessment of utility model legislation on innovation in selected countries (for the European Commission, DG Internal Market). Alfred is member of the associations DeGEval (German association of evaluation) and LES (Licensing Executives Society).

Alfred Radauer holds a master's degree in international commerce from the Vienna University of Economics and Business and is fluent in German, English (education at the American International School in Vienna) and Romanian (2nd mother tongue).
